The Nemon Studio Museum is surrounded by trees and fields off a quiet lane on Boars Hill, twenty minutes drive from the centre of Oxford.


"Scandal in High Society Oxfordshire"

Her six chosen topics above ranged from Tudor to Victorian times and each account was illustrated by pictures and portraits of victims and possible culprits.


There was a surprise moment when a photograph of Cherie Blair appeared almost by error and we wondered if we were going to be treated to details of more modern intrigue and scandal.

The Mid-Week Walk from Aldworth


Eric and Sheila Dunford organised a midweek walk on Thursday 13th October.
