



Richard brought souvenirs of his time in Newfoundland, including a bottle of 'Screech' Rum!



"Titanic... did the Moon sink it?" A talk to the Astronomy Group by Barry Kellett Thursday 25th January 2024

The regular items of News and Sightings and the Members Matter images were followed by the invited talk by Barry Kellett (from the Rutherford Appleton Laboratory) with the intriguing title *"Titanic...did the Moon sink it?"*.



Barry raised the first point about the impact of the Moon on Titanic – there was no moon, so that made icebergs harder to see for the lookout on watch (like the mystery of the dog in the night?)

Barry also described an exceptionally high tide that occurred about 100 days before the fateful night, which arose from a highly unusual combination of the moon being closer to earth and the earth being at its closest to the sun at a spring tide. There is a theory that this exceptionally high tide made have lead to more icebergs than normal being calved from a glacier in Greenland, the main source of icebergs arriving in the NW Atlantic.

He discussed the main problem with that theory, that icebergs typically take much longer than 100 days to get from the calving glacier to the shipping lanes, although an exceptionally high tide might dislodge an iceberg stranded in a bay on the route south and cause the hazard.
