



The Alfred Jewel - Convent Thoughts (Charles Alston Collins) - Iznik Plate

We are privileged to have a guided tour of the Ashmolean Museum to uncover some of the treasures of the collection, from ancient to modern.

Our tour guide will be Jude Barrett. She will lead us through galleries representing each department of the Museum, so you will have an opportunity to see objects from the ancient world such as iron age musical Instruments, beautifully carved monumental reliefs from Assyrian palaces, the enigmatic Alfred jewel, also coins and precious objects from across Oxfordshire, including the Watlington Hoard, about which James Mather, who discovered the hoard, gave a talk to Marcham Society a year or so back.

We will also feature the beauty of arts from China and Japan as well as a selection of Western art works including Uccello, Titian, Reynolds, Vernet, Pissarro, Turner and the Pre Raphaelites. There will also be ceramics and textiles to see.

The tour will take an hour and then we will be taken to the Learning Studio at the Ashmolean to see some objects up close and possibly handle them. This special session will be half an hour, finishing around noon. For those who would like to stay on for lunch at the Ashmolean, there is a café located on the lower ground floor, offering a selection of freshly-made meals from soups, to quiches and salads or a roof top restaurant serving more substantial meals.
